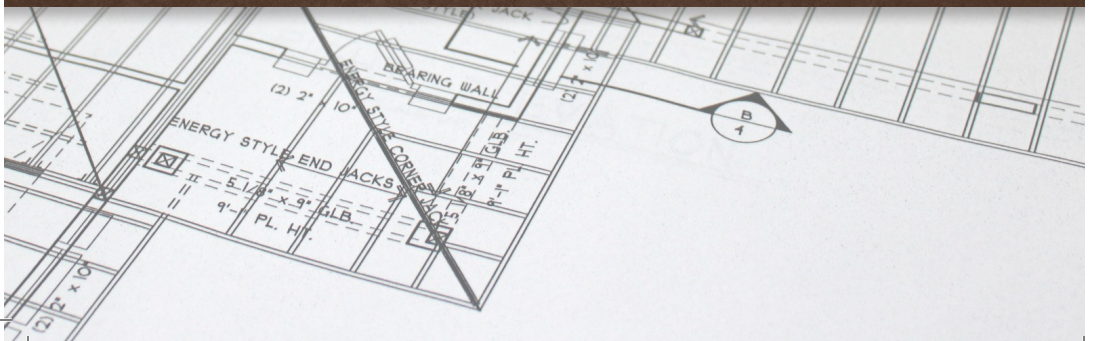




SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS



Week 1: February 28 / March 3

An Unfinished Vision

Hebrews 11:8 and Genesis 12

1. How likely are you to begin something if you don't know all the details? How is this similar or different to the way Abram (Abraham) responded in the verses above?
2. What do you think Abram's life would have looked like if he hadn't chosen to take a step into the unknown?
3. How would others have been impacted if Abram chose to settle for living in the knowns rather than believing God for something that had yet to happen?

What is one thing you can do this week to step out in faith, even if you don't understand the big picture or the potential impact of your one step?

Week 2: March 7 / March 10

An Unfinished Community

Genesis 13–14

1. The land couldn't support Abram and his entourage as well as Lot's crew. Abram strategically created a plan that prevented quarrelling while allowing them to thrive more effectively. What are some ways that you can increase your effectiveness by working with others?
2. What might have happened if Abram didn't create that plan with Lot? How might we miss out if we operate as silos rather than in collaboration with others?
3. What are some the benefits you've experienced by working in conjunction with a community?
4. What are some of the community impacts of the Unfinished Initiative, both immediately on the Discovery campus as well as throughout the city and surrounding area?

Week 3: March 14 / March 17

An Unfinished Display of Gratitude

Genesis 14

1. According to Genesis 14:14-16, who fought against the four kings that had captured Lot? Who did Melchizedek credit for their victory?
2. How might Abram have responded differently if he disagreed with Melchizedek?
3. Our culture teaches that success is due to skill and hard work, yet the Bible shows that most “wins” are a result of God’s hand. How does this mentality shape the way you manage the things you have such as your finances, housing and relationships?
4. Abram gave of his resources and was blessed. What are some examples you’ve seen in which a person giving is blessed as much or more than the person receiving the gift?
5. Does the commitment you’re considering for the Unfinished Campaign demonstrate your display of gratitude towards God?

What are two specific actions you can take to show your gratitude to God for the things He has entrusted you with?

Week 4: March 21 / March 24

An Unfinished Identity

Genesis 17

1. What are some of the ways Abram was changed as a result of being faithful to walking out in faith to fulfill God's call on his life?
2. How many people's lives were transformed as a result of Abram's obedience?
3. How could your commitment to the Unfinished Initiative transform your identity as well as that of people you might not even know?
4. Does your Unfinished commitment display an identity of faith or are you choosing a number you can manage on your own?

Walking in the Unfinished

Commit to spending time each day in prayer this week for those whose identities will change as a result of the Unfinished Initiative. Pray for those who will give of their time and resources as well as those who will have their lives transformed due to someone else's faithfulness.

Week 5: March 28 / March 31

An Unfinished Burden and Boldness

Genesis 18

1. Abraham had a burden for the people in Sodom yet he coupled it with a boldness to act on that burden. What would have happened if he had one without the other?
2. What do you think Broomfield and the surrounding area will look like ten years from now if Discovery and other local churches didn't have a burden for the city?
3. How does that compare with how you envision our city generations from now after decades of believers have lived out the love of Christ to their neighbors in word and deed?
4. What, if anything, is getting in your way of living out an unfinished burden and boldness? Do debt, fear and/or security keep you from acting on your burden for others?

How will you couple a burden for the lost and hurting with a boldness to act on their behalf?

Week 5: April 4 / April 7

An Unfinished Legacy

Acts 17

1. How did Abraham's obedience pave the way for Paul to tell others about God?
2. How did the obedience of those from earlier generations create a pathway for you to learn of God's love?
3. Nearly 2000 years after Abraham's call, Paul preached on Mars Hill. When working in community with others through the Unfinished Initiative, how many generations do you think your legacy could positively impact?
4. Think about those who created a legacy before you—whether that be those who previously pledged to help build Discovery, family members from past generations who prayed for you, etc. What monetary value would you place on the legacy they passed on to you? What value will you place on the legacy you'll pass on to others?
